Château Saint Martial



This estate was created two centuries ago on the banks of the Dordogne, in Saint Emilion, on the site of the old chapel of Saint Martial, destroyed in 1792. It belongs to the Dupeyrat family since that time. The vineyard spreads on a plateau, on sandy-gravel soils. Its 4 hectares are planted with the finest grape varieties of Saint Emilion.

The menhir: There was a Neolithic stonemason workshop near the menhir of Saint Martial. This menhir, 5 meters high, gave its name to the «hameau» and has an offering hole. It is classified as a historical monument.

Vinification

Grapes are destemmed and pressed before vatting. Wine batches are pumped every day during the fermentation. Temperature control. Vatting lasts 3 weeks. Then, the wine is aged during 12 months for 35% in cement vats, 25% in new oak barrel and 40% in aged oak barrel.



Tasting Notes

This wine has a beautiful dress, a deep color, it has a powerful, expressive nose marked mainly by the fruit. On the palate, it is woody, supple with ripe fruit and a silky finish.



Suggested dishes

It can be paired with a filet mignon with honey sauce and fresh vegetables.
